Be an Organ Donor

Now, read it again with genuine enthusiasm. "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind."

Verse 38 tells us why we read it with emphasis. *"This is the first and greatest commandment."* That is how important it is to God. If we do this in love for God, He will bless our efforts to love others.

The doctors need permission to share your human organs with another person. No one can make that call for you. It is your commitment, and your commitment alone, to make. It might save the life of someone else. The same is true of giving your heart to God. The faith of friends and family doesn't make you a Christian. It is your choice to make. If you make this commitment, giving your heart to God, you can help others to live.
