We sorted through electrical gadgets he created, earning the family title of "gadget man." He had a solution to every problem.

Dad always was there when people needed help – whether at church, family or in the community. You don't realize the depth of his service until you dig deeper into his life. Dad had quite a legacy, but he never touted about it. He just did it.

Jesus Christ is the ultimate legacy. His work is well documented, thanks to the Bible and other supporting references. Jesus rallied to help people and then humbly said not to tell others what He had done. It was all about the other person's need and never about himself.
