One of my granddaughter's favorite children's books is titled "Mine-a-Saur." It is a story about a young dinosaur that goes to school and gets very possessive of toys other young dinosaurs at the

school were playing with. He keeps saying, "It's mine. Mine. Mine." As he is saying those words he grabs the toys away from everyone else. As I read the story to Abigail I use a whiney tone when I say "Mine, mine, mine." My granddaughter immediately retreats to the opposite end of the couch, staying as far away from me as possible – but still listening to the story.



In our own lives we get possessive of things, too. We may not grab things away from others, but we convince ourselves that we earned something – so it must be "mine, mine, mine." We forget that *all* we have comes from God. We forget that God may have blessed us with a wonderful family, the opportunity to live in this country and the skills that translate into our ability to support our family. The nice house, late model car, the boat or RV in the driveway – are all because of God's blessings on our life.
