
At the baptism the pastor read the familiar scripture verse: Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 18:3).

Looking at our smiling, happy grandson, the Bible verse made sense. Adults set up arbitrary boundaries that limit their achievement. Adults are preoccupied with the enormity of life and look for reasons to avoid investing themselves fully in deepening their faith. In contrast, a child has no boundaries. He just wants to explore and learn. So, when Jesus said, Truly I

tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it (Luke 18:17), it made perfect sense. A youthful zeal and an eagerness to learn is the key to a true relationship with Jesus.
