## Priorities Can Change a Life?

This weekend my wife passed the gavel to the incoming President of the North Carolina Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood. Kathy completed a rewarding five-year commitment on the organization's state board, the final year as

its President. Being a retired teacher the P.E.O. mission aligns with a passion of Kathy's — the enhancement of women through education. She was a middle school science teacher for many years and the teaching profession is represented in every branch of our family tree for generations.

Being the state President has to be a priority as it is a major commitment. The role of being the state chapter President takes so much time that many people retire from their day job in order to devote the time necessary to be successful.

Service to others has always been important to Kathy. The past five years she has chosen a priority service to be through P.E.O.

As important as it is, however, it fits behind Faith and Family in her hierarchy of priorities. She has never let anything come before God, first, and then her family.
