Many local people went to that wall to pay their respects to friends and relatives whose names are inscribed. Inside the VFW, there were photos and artifacts from that conflict. The pictures showed the unmistakable camaraderie that existed even in the face of gruesome battle pictures. These were people who answered the call of duty with their total commitment.

While we all realize the total commitment of Jesus Christ, we sometimes overlook that God asks for our total



commitment to Him. Being a follower of Jesus Christ permeates every decision in our lives. Just as we enjoy the freedom of living in the United States, Jesus gives us freedom from our sins. We have a unique bond with our Lord and Savior through prayer and our faith. We also have a unique bond with fellow believers enduring everyday life's battles. Our faith requires total commitment. When you "step on the plane" of being a believer, you commit to the life-changing cause of Christianity. Jesus gave His life for our freedom.

Thousands of patriots died for our freedom, protecting our right to worship and live in a free country. Servicemen and women step out of their comfort zone to protect the freedoms of others. Jesus wants us to share the gospel with others so that they might receive forgiveness and enjoy freedom from their sins.

Let us pledge our allegiance – to the flag and to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It is our Total Commitment.
