As Christians, we can be veterans of the faith in Christ. It involves some of the characteristics of those who have served in the military. The basic steps are similar:



- 1- Obey the Commander
- 2- Engage the enemy
- 3- Fight to the end

We fight as Christians to win souls for Christ – in our families, communities, nation, and worldwide. Wars are inevitable in this sinful world, but so is the resistance to God as a higher power. Christians stand up for what they know is right, even in the face of opposition. Winning souls for Christ is an important cause, just as the cause of freedom won by our veterans. When we stand up for Christ, we fight for the freedoms Jesus has won for believers. Let us be willing to fight for Him. *Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? What is that final victory? It is an "honor flight" to an eternal destination.
